Korakrit Arunanondchai: 'Being an artist is about inducing a sacred moment'

The elusive artist gets behind the camera for this video self-portrait

'I see all art as a form of storytelling,' says **Korakrit Arunanondchai** – and there are stories aplenty in the work of the Thai-born, US-based artist. Personal memories, obscure historical events, and animistic rituals are among his plethoric set of references. They inform a practice spanning from video to performance and crop up in visual feasts as intriguing as they are alluring.
